

Rev. Dr. Katy Hinman is an elder in full connection in the

North Georgia Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. She currently serves in extension ministry at the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) in Washington, DC, as the Director of the Dialogue on Science, Ethics, and Religion (DoSER). Katy earned her Master of Divinity degree from Candler School of Theology at Emory University.

Her previous appointments have been as the Pastor of College Park First United Methodist Church in College Park, Georgia and as the Associate Pastor at Decatur First United Methodist Church in Decatur, Georgia.

Prior to entering the ministry, Katy earned a BA in biology from Carleton College in Northfield, Minnesota, and a PhD in Ecology and Evolution from Stony Brook University in Stony Brook, New York. Her dissertation research focused on bat pollination of agave plants in southeastern Arizona, and she served as the Bat Biologist for the Arizona Game and Fish Department. During and after seminary, Katy served as the Executive Director of Georgia Interfaith Power & Light, a non-profit that works with faith communities on environmental issues.

Katy lives in Washington, DC, with her husband Jonathan Brown, Associate Pastor at Foundry United Methodist Church, and their three children, three cats, and two dogs.
